Part 5: INTERVIEW (110 points)

You will be asked eight impromptu interview questions. At the end of the interview, you will be given an opportunity to add additional comments or clarify previous responses. Each applicant will be asked the same eight questions by the same person. You are expected to appear as you would for a job interview. At the beginning of the interview, you are expected to briefly introduce yourself to the selection committee. Interviews traditionally take approximately 20-25 minutes. The questions are designed to put a face behind the application, get to know you as a person, give you a chance to advocate on your own behalf, and facilitate confidence in awarding this scholarship. **Remember this is not a financial aid scholarship. It is an earned honor scholarship.** You will be judged on appropriate attire, poise, verbal expression, and presentation (sensible, honest and direct).
