SCHOLARSHIPS FOR GRANGE MEMBERS!

If you are a Grange member and have a graduating senior in your immediate family, that senior could earn up to \$2,000 in Grange-sponsored scholarships good for trade schools or college.


If you're not yet a Grange member, you can join. See the member application form on the last page of this newsletter. Join as a family for \$70 (covering all members of your immediate family), or purchase a membership for the graduating senior. Individual memberships are \$40.

Upon joining, the graduating senior can fill out TWO separate scholarship applications. One is for \$1,000 from the Montana State Grange. The other is for \$1,000 from Whitepine Grange. It is possible for one candidate to win both scholarships.

Why the requirement to join the Grange? It's because membership in a civic-minded, highly respected organization like the Grange is a crucial part of becoming a responsible adult. Community involvement starts at the grassroots level and can play a huge part in any developing career, be it engineering or plumbing.





Each year Whitepine Grange purchases student dictionaries and distributes them to all third-graders in Trout Creek, Noxon, and Thompson Falls.


The dictionaries chosen for the project double as history books and mini-encyclopedias containing fascinating facts and figures about U.S. Presidents, geography, state capitols and more.

Purchasing these dictionaries is, and will always be, in the Grange budget as it's been for decades. The dictionary program, which is called "Words for Thirds," is national in scope. Many Granges and other civic organizations take part in it as a community service.

Patty English has headed up Whitepine Grange's "Words for Thirds" project for several years. Her favorite part, she says, is handing out the dictionaries to kids in their third-grade classrooms.

"It's so fun to see how excited these kids get when they receive their very own dictionaries," she says.

Identity Fraud: Not "if" but "when" it happens to you

Shortly before Christmas, our bank notified us of a security breach and suggested steps we should take to protect ourselves. The offending parties had apparently accessed our names, social security numbers and birthdates.

I went to the bank to get the info first-hand. As I stood in line waiting for a teller, an elderly couple was discussing the same situation with the teller next door. They were obviously bewildered, and I heard the gentleman say, "What I'd like to do is just ignore this." The teller gave him a sympathetic look and advised him to instead take the steps the bank was suggesting to mitigate the situation. Ignoring it wasn't the answer.

My own teller was similarly somber about this misfortune. She advised me, step by step, what to do to prevent any future problems that may arise from this security breach. Basically, she suggested we contact all three major credit bureaus and put a "freeze" on our reports so no unauthorized person could access and tamper with them. She also suggested getting at least one credit report each year to oversee the situation, and of course to monitor our credit card statements and charges at least monthly.

This security breach wasn't our fault. We hadn't initiated it by clicking on anything or responding to strange phone calls. It just happened. Expect that it will happen to you too, and be prepared. Follow your bank's advice. **Follow through.** Preventing identity theft is far easier than trying to reclaim it once it is stolen from you. —JM
